TWEEDIE TALKS.

New Brunswick Premier Interviewed in Montreal.

WILL OPOSE REDUCTION OF PROVINCIAL REPRESENTATION IN THE FEDERAL PARLIAMENT - Premier Murray of Nova Scotia on the Fast Line.

MONTREAL, Aug. 21 - Hon. L. J. Tweedie, premier of New Brunswick, who returned from England on the Lake Simcoe, which arrived here today, in an interview said: "There is not any doubt that when the premiers of the different maritime provinces meet in Quebec during the month of September private conferences will be held, at which it will be decided what action the different provinces will take should an attempt be made to reduce our representation in parliament."
