THOROUGH BRED HORSE BREEDING; ADVANTAGES NEW BRUNSWICK FARMERS HAVE

The great demand which there has been for all parts of Canada for the colts from such thoroughbred stallions imported to the province as Young Cannon Ball in 1836, Tam O'Shanter in 1838, Randolph in 1840, John of Kent in 1845, Retriever and Livingston, by John H. Reid and Hugh McMonagle, respectively, in 1846. Walrus, an inbred race senger, therefore, a thoroughbred, came earlier, and his stock is spoken of freely.

There is, therefore, every reason why we should use good thoroughbred blood, and this year our people have the opportunity at various points, largely due to the interest taken by the Provincial Government through its splendid stallions at St. John and Fredericton, one at Sussex, one at Debec, one at Bathurst, one at St. Stephen and one near Hartland, in Victoria county.

All these horses are capable of siring road horses of speed and endurance, and half bred mares from them will make the very best kind of stock to breed to Hackney and French coach stallions, for handsome carriage horses, or to trotting stallions for endurance and speed.

There is also a strong probability of there being an active demand in the near future for army horses, and it is the good stout half bred that is wanted for this purpose.

While the main business of the New Brunswick farmer should probably be the raising of good draught horses for his own purposes and for sale, there is yet a large place for good road horses, and it is to help this end of the business that the use of thoroughbred blood is mainly urged.

INSISTED ON HAVING THE HALF-HOLIDAY

What it means for working people to be their own masters for one afternoon a week with the opportunity of a week-end outing, may be gathered from the action taken yesterday and on Saturday by the employees of Hamm Bros. biscuit and candy factory, on Main street.

There are about thirty people in all employed in this factory. Many of them are girls. They asked the firm this year to give them the Saturday half-holiday during June, as well as for July and August, which have been their months for the privilege in other years.

When the demand was refused the employees of the factory walked out, and there was no work done after 11 o'clock on Saturday afternoon. The firm's action was to deduct a half day's wages from the employees' pay. When the work people became aware of this move, they decided to leave the factory to itself, and not even the engine was started yesterday morning, the engineer being among the strikers. The employees informed the owners that they would not go to work unless they were given the half-holiday for the month of June and their wages were left unchanged.

Later, a delegation from the strikers conferred with the firm, and a compromise was arranged by which Saturdays are to be full working days during this month, but the employees are still to have three half-holiday months with September substituted for June.
