

Conservatives Sweep Canada

Returns From All Over The Dominion Showing A Complete Turnover

CONTEST WAS KEEN
IN YESTERDAY'S FIGHT

Liberals Had Advantage in
Transportation Facilities by
About Two to One—Weather
Favorable.

If the weather had been made to order for the occasion, yesterday's election could not have been fought under more favorable conditions for both parties. A fine sunny morning with just a hint of the autumn nip in the air to lend an added zest to the proceedings as if any were needed. The workers in the different wards were all at their posts early but until the polls opened there was nothing for them to do. The instructions had been issued to both sides some days ago and the workers were well equipped with the information regarding their wards which is so essential to the actual last day work of an election.

Early in the day it became apparent that the fight would be a hard one. There was also early evidence that the sinews of war were not lacking, and it is safe to say that the Grif was larger than at any previous contest.

The contest was keen and the workers on both sides lost no opportunity to look after voters. During the early morning hours this was not so noticeable as along toward when the workers in the factories and mills as well as the great army of clerks whose business called them before the polls were open in the morning sallied forth to their midday meal and also to exercise their franchise.

There was no need for any to walk, particularly if they were even suspected of Liberal leanings, for carriages and automobiles were ready to take them to their wards. This was particularly noticeable on the West Side where a string of carriages and automobiles were in waiting at the ferry boat at the time of arrival of all the trips from 12 to 2 o'clock. There were as many masses as hits in the efforts to guess at the political allegiance of the voters and more than one good Conservative voter was driven to the polls in an automobile paid for by a Liberal.

If anything, the Conservatives put up the straighter fight. Many cases were found where Liberal workers were willing to trade a vote for Daniel in exchange for a vote for Mr. Pugsley. In fact the proposition was made on more than one occasion to drop Mr. Lowell and concentrate all the efforts on the minister.

Challenges were frequent in all the wards. In Kings ward a traveller who had come to the city to vote was challenged by the Conservatives on the ground that he had received remuneration for coming to the city. He refused to take the oath although urged to do so by Liberal workers and left the booth a very much disgusted man.

One of the funniest incidents of the day was that Timothy Donovan, the Liberal leader in Brooks ward found out at the last minute that his name had been inadvertently omitted from the official list of voters, and when he went to the booth to cast his ballot he was prevented from doing so. Mr. Donovan at once sought to have the mistake rectified, but as far as known was not successful. Reports from all over the province were to the effect that the weather was fine and a very large vote was being polled.
