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From Yesterday's Second Edition. Great Court. The Circuit Court opened this forenoon, Judge Wetmore presiding. There was a large attendance of spectators, members of the legal fraternity, and jurymen. The roll of Grand Jurors, and jurymen, was called, and the names of William Breeze, Chas. A. F. Figures, D. M. McDonald, J. H. Murray, R. C. Adams, A. A.
