one who always took much interest in its affairs; John V Gale, a life member since 1845; Revd. Henry Doyle Sewell, an ordinary member, and Mr. Benjamin Daikers an ordinary member. The latter gentleman during his residence in Quebec was one of our most energetic and useful members, he was First Vice President in 1868, and during that year removed to Montreal to the great regret of his fellow-members. He was a prominent member of the St. George's Society of Montreal at the time of his death. Colonel John Dyde, one of the original promoters of the society and to whom reference was made in the last ahnual report, also passed away, deeply regretted, during the year.

St. George's day falling on Good Friday the usual anniversary service was held in the Cathedral on the evening of the 28th April when a sermon was preached by Rev. F. E. J. Lloyd, the Rev. G. V. Housman, Rev. M. M. Fothergill and Rev. Lennox Williams assisting in the service. The musical portion was kindly undertaken by Mr. E. A. Bishop, organist assisted by the ladies and gentlemen of his choir and others, to all of whom the thanks of the society are due for their valuable services. The collection in aid of the charitable fund amounted to \$68.39. His Eminence the Cardinal Archbishop of Quebec having been installed in his high office in July last, the President of this Society was invited to attend the ceremonies connected therewith in the Basilica, and the dinner given by His Eminence in the Music Hall, at both of which places he received much politeness and attention.
