The World Bank has recently* made loans totalling U.S. \$108.2 million to:

	Amount \$	Term	Interest
a) Republic of China	31.2 Million	15½ years (3½ years grace)	6½ per cent
b) Republic of Korea	45 Million	30 years (7 years grace)	6½ per cent
c) Trinidad and Tobago	2 Million	15 years (2 years grace)	6½ per cent
d) Yugoslavia	30 Million	25 years (5 years grace)	6½ per cent

*The loan to the Republic of Korea was announced on May 16, 1969; the loans to the Republic of China, Trinidad and Tobago, and Yugoslavia were announced on May 28, 1969.
