INDIANS' CLAIMS TO CROWN LANDS

Government De-Dominion : cides to Submit Case to the Courts

Vancouver, May 26.—After an agitation lasting for several years, during which time the Provincial and Dominion governments were successively important to listen to the complaints and claims of the Aborigines. It has just been decided by the authorities at Ottawa to submit to judicial hearing the case of the British Columbis Indians who contend that they are entitled to a share of the crown lands in this province.

Information to this effect was received to-day by representatives of the Indians from lawyers in the east who acted in the presentation of the claims at Ottawa. It is stated that the case will be submitted to either the supreme court if Canada or the privy council, and that action to this end will be takent mortly after the close of the corona on festivities, the latter part of next month.

Some time ago parties who had interested themselves in the cisims of the Indians waited on the provincial covernment and asked that a stated case he submitted to the courts, but the request was refused on the ground that the aborigines had no case in law. Then followed an appeal to Ottawa, with the result that a decision has been reached to settle for all time whether or not the Indians have any legal claims to the crown lands of British Columbia.
