

of Montreal, the Ottawa is finally merged in the St. Lawrence, 180 miles below the city of Ottawa.

Take a bird's-eye view of the Valley of the Ottawa, and we see spread out before us a country equal to eight times the extent of the State of Vermont, or ten times the extent of Massachusetts—with its great artery, the Ottawa, curving through it, resembling the Rhine in length of course, but exceeding it in magnitude.

The immense region overlies a variety of geological formation, and presents all their characteristic features, from the level uniform surface of the Silurian system, which prevails along a great extent of the south shore of the Ottawa, to the rugged and romantic ridges in the metamorphic and primitive formations, which stretch far away to the north-west.

As far as our knowledge of the country extends, we find a greater part of it covered with a luxuriant growth of white and red pine forest in the world, abundantly intersected with large rivers, to convey the timber to market when manufactured.

The remaining portion of it is not so valuable wooded presents a very advantageous and extensive field for settlement.

From the numerous townships already surveyed and partly settled, and the large tracts of land interspersed throughout the timber country, the great region on the upper course of the western tributaries of the Ottawa, behind the Red Pine country, exceeds the State of New Hampshire in extent, with an equal climate and superior soil.

It is generally a beautiful undulating country, wooded with a rich growth of maple, birch, beech, elm, &c., and watered with lakes and streams, affording numerous mill sites, and abounding in fish.

Flanking the lumber country on one side, which presents an excellent market for produce, and joining Lake Huron on the other, the situation of this tract, though comparatively inland, is highly advantageous.

In the diversity of resources, the Ottawa country presents unusual inducements alike to agriculture and commercial enterprise.

The operations of the lumberers give an annual value to the produce of the most distant settlers, by the great demand they create on the spot: while the profits of lumbering yield those engaged in it a command of wealth which otherwise could not be had in the country.

The value of the resources of the Ottawa country to the inhabitants of the Ottawa valley will be evident on comparing the value of their exports with those of other countries.

Take, for instance, the state of Maine, as American enterprise is so much talked of, with all its commercial advantages, and the enterprising character of its people, when its population was upwards of five hundred thousand, its exports amounted in value to \$1,075,633; but the value of the exports of the Ottawa country amounts to double that sum, with less than one-third the population.

If such be the case now, how much more it will be, when, in addition to the more extensive production of agriculture, the unlimited water power which the Ottawa and its tributaries afford, is brought into operation, if even partially applied to general manufactures, as well as that of deals.

Nor are the mineral resources of the Ottawa country to be overlooked—and here the Gatineau offers its very rich deposits of iron, and the numerous veins of copper, lead, zinc, and silver, which are scattered in the Ottawa valley, will yet become of commercial importance.

To judge of the importance of the Ottawa country, we should consider the population which has been gathered there, and the commercial resources which are being developed. Taking the present condition of New Hampshire as a data, without noticing its great importance in commercial advantages, the Ottawa country, when equally advanced, which is not much to say, should maintain three millions of inhabitants. But taking Scotland as our data, which the Ottawa country surely equals in soil, and might, with its peculiar advantages, resemble in commerce and manufactures, the Valley of the Ottawa should ultimately maintain a population of eight millions of souls.

BURNING OF THE PROPELLER "TINTO!"

8 LIVES LOST!—14 SAVED!—S. M. N. The Kingston "Herald" received the following account of this lamentable calamity, from the lips of the pilot, Robert Lacey:

"The 'Tinto' left Montreal on the 10th inst., at 6 o'clock, with a full cargo of dry goods, and a crew of 22 hands including captain and crew."

The number of passengers he believed to be seven—six came aboard at Montreal, at Prescott, named McCortie of Kingston, and a woman named Mrs. Lacey, at 9 o'clock, ship was under way, and about five miles beyond Nine Mile Point light, when the fire broke out. It was first discovered coming out near the smoke-pipe at the end of the boiler, where there was a quantity of dry wood piled; the flames lit up through it from below. Our informant just got to bed, when he was alarmed by a cry of fire; he jumped on deck, the first he saw was the casing round the funnel at this time there was no boat in sight. Nine Mile Point light was quite visible. Captain was on deck, and immediately ordered a boat to be hoisted for the light was done. There was only one on board—our informant went with other people on the tackle. While swinging the tackle, the women and children were on the boat, so that when the flames at that part of the vessel, the boat could be lowered. The engine was working all right, but the pilot house was in flames, and the pilot kept her head to the light. The boat had to leave the engine, so that when necessary to stop—it could do so.

The flames spread with such rapidity when about three miles from the land, that the boat was forced to lower. The boat was occupied by four women, three children, the steward—the engines still went. When it touched the water, the tackle could be unfastened, and the boat shipped water—still its occupants were safe, as the engines stopped the heat was so great that a number of hands slid down the sides into the boat and capsized her.
