CAP. VII.

An Act to make perpetual an Act of the Fifty-eighth Year of His late Majesty, to allow the Importation into certain Ports in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, of certain enumerated Articles, and the Re-exportation thereof from such Ports.

[24th March 1821.]

HEREAS an Act passed in the Fifty-eighth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled An Act to allow for Three Years, and until Six Weeks after 58G.3.c. 19. the Commencement of the then next Session of Parliament, the Importation into Ports specially appointed by His Majesty, within the Provinces of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, of the Articles therein enumerated, and the Re-exportation thereof from such Ports; which said Act will expire Six Weeks after the Commencement of the Session of Parliament which shall be held after the Eighth Day of May One thousand eight hundred and twenty-one: And whereas it is expedient that the said Act should be made perpetual; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament
