and it is hereby further enacted by the Authority afozesaid, That if any Person of Persons thall give og grant any falle Certificate, Cocket, og Clearance, fog any of the Purpoles required og Directed by this Ac, fuch Person of Persons hall forfeit the Sum of Five hundled Pounds, and be rendered incapable of ferving Dis Wajeffp, Dis Beirs and Successogs, in any Dffice whatfoever; and if any Perfon of Perfons thall counterfeit, erafe, alter, og fallify, any Certificate, Cocket, of Clearance, required of directed by this Ad, of thall knowingly or willingly make use of any falle Certificate, Cocket, og Cicarance, og of any Certificate, Cocket, og Cicarance, fo counterfeited, eraled, altered, og fallified. such Person of Persons hall, sog every such Diffence, forfeit the Sum of five bundled Pounds, and such Certificate, Cocket, og Clearance, hall be invalid and of no Effett.

How Penalties and Forteitures may be profecuted and applied.

and be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid. That the feveral Fogfeitures and Penalties inflicted by this At, thall and may be profecuted, fued for, and recovered, and be divided, paid, and applied, in like Manner as other Penalties and Fogfeitures infliced by any Act of Acts of Parliament, relating to the Trade or Revenues of the British Colonies of Plantations in America, are directed to be profecuted, sued for, or recovered, divided, paid, and applied, by Two several Ads of Parliament, the Dne passed in the fourth pear of his pielent Bajelly, intituled, An Act for granting certain Duties in the British Colonies and Plantations in America; for continuing, amending, and making perpetual, an Act passed in the Sixth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, intituled, An Act for the better securing and encouraging the Trade of His Majesty's Sugar Colonies in America; for applying the Produce of such Duties, and of the Duties to arise by virtue of the faid Act, towards defraying the Expences of defending, protecting, and fecuring, the faid Colonies and Plantations; for explaining an Act made in the Twentyfifth Year of the Reign of King Charles the Second, intituled, An Ast for the Encouragement of the Greenland
