

Biologist to speak at UNB

Relationships between host and parasite in red seaweeds is the subject of a guest lecture by Lynda J. Goff of the Biology Department of the University of California in Santa Cruz.

Dr. Goff's lecture will be held at the University of New Brunswick in Fredericton on Thursday, February 20, at 4p.m. in room B146 of Loring Bailey Hall. Her visit is sponsored by the Visiting Lecturer's Fund and the UNB Biology Department.

The lecture, entitled "A New Regulatory Mechanism of Parasitism: Nuclear Transfer from Parasite to Host," studies how genetic information may

be transferred from parasite to host by migration of nuclei from cells of one to cells of the other.

Dr. Goff is a graduate of Western Oregon State University (BSc '71) and the University of British Columbia (PhD '75). She was selected as a

Fulbright Senior Research Fellow in Australia in 1983-84. Along with being an associate professor at the University of California, she is a member of the Center for Coastal Marine

Sciences at the institution. Dr. Goff also serves on the National Advisory Committee on Women in Science and in

1982-83 was the first recipient of a research grant from Visiting Professorships for Women in Science and Engineering.
