Introduction of Hon. John Curtin  
Prime Minister of Australia  
House of Commons - June 1, 1944

MR. SPEAKER:

I should like to move, seconded by my honourable friend the Acting Leader of the Opposition:

That the sitting of the House be suspended, during pleasure, for the purpose of welcoming in the Chamber the Honourable John Curtin, Prime Minister of the Commonwealth of Australia, and that the speeches delivered on this occasion be inserted in the House of Commons Debates and form part of the permanent records of this Parliament.

This is one of a number of occasions throughout the years of war upon which we have had both the satisfaction and the great pleasure of welcoming to the Parliament of Canada distinguished visitors from other nations. It is a particular pleasure to welcome today the Prime Minister of Australia in the person of the Honourable John Curtin, who is now returning to Australia from the meeting of Prime Ministers in London.
