PROSECUTION RCE, having been sworn, is examined by the
Prosecution:

- Q. Would you tell the Court what you know about the
suspected theft of cigarettes at your Unit?
A. The first inkling I had was when Sgt Satterlee re-
ported it to me at approximately 0800 hours at
breakfast in the Mess on 8 Aug 46. He reported that
cigarettes had been stolen and also stated that he
had put a guard on the evening before, the 7th. I
wasn't in the Unit on the 7th. He asked permission
to continue this guard to try and catch the party or
parties that had hidden the cigarettes under the
stairs. I gave him that permission. At approximately
1700 hours L/Cpl Atkinson called me from the Mess and
said that eight packages had been taken from the cache
under the stairs. He reported to me that there had
been 8 packages taken out. I called CQMS Naylor who
was in his office and we talked outside the office.
He has had much experience in detective work and I wanted
him to hear the story. I instructed the CQMS to call
in the SIS. At approximately 1745 hours I ordered a
car and went to Stamford Hill and picked up Spr
Stanley just as he got off a bus. CQMS Naylor, S/Sgt
Miller of the SIS and Atkinson were with myself at this
time. Stanley was invited into the car to return to
the Unit. We brought him back to the QM's Office
where he was questioned. We came back in the SIS car.
We started out with a car from the Unit and came back
in the SIS car. S/Sgt Miller asked him to return to
the Unit. I handed Spr Stanley over to the SIS for
questioning. After considerable conversation and
denials Stanley said he had no cigarettes on him. The
