

Rules and Regulations of the Boys' Home

I.

The Superintendent and Matron who are engaged to take charge of the Institution, shall be competent to give the Boys instruction in reading, spelling, writing and arithmetic which will qualify them for useful employment. The Matron may also admit applicants, subject to the approbation of the daily visitors.

II.

Boys, from the age of five to fourteen, are admitted as inmates. Those from seven to ten years of age, may be engaged to work out, at seven-pence half-penny per week for two hours a day. Those from ten to fourteen are to receive three-pence for the first two hours, and afterwards one penny an hour.

III.

A third of the Boys' earnings to go towards the support of the Institution, the surplus to be placed in the hands of the Treasurer, to be deposited in the Savings Bank.
