THE RENEWAL OF PROFESSION OF THE MEMBERS OF THE THIRD ORDER OF ST. FRANCIS.

On Sunday, April 26th, the renewal of the profession of the members of the Third Order of St. Francis took place at the Franciscan Church, Dorchester street, Montreal. The ceremony commenced at 2.30 o'clock with the recitation of the Office of the Most Blessed Virgin, during which the "Magnificat" and "Ave Marie Stella" were sung.

Trade in all lines of cattle, with the exception of exporters, was fairly good at the Toronto Cattle Market, to-day. The export business is practically dead, pending the settlement of the Montreal market, but the movement in other cattle was fairly active.

Here the preacher sketched the sufferings of the Apostles as foretold by Our Divine Saviour: "You shall lament and weep; your sorrows shall be turned into joy, and your joy no man shall take from you."

"If they have persecuted Me, they will also persecute you," the sufferings of St. Paul including his being in prison, in perils, stoned, hunger and thirst, his solicitude for the different churches, were also clearly dwelt upon.

THE MARKET REPORTS.

Live Stock Trade Improved—Grain is Lower—Latest Quotations. Tuesday Evening, May 5. Toronto St. Lawrence Market.

There was a general improvement in trade at St. Lawrence Market to-day, the receipts in most lines being heavier. The total grain receipts amounted to 1,600 bushels.

Export Cattle—There was practically no trade done. Hardly three loads were offered and quotations are nominal and unchanged.

Stocks and Feeders—There continues a moderate demand for these cattle, but no great number are coming forward. The total receipts amounted to 74 cars, including 1,169 cattle, 222 sheep and lambs, 87 hogs and 53 calves.

Calves—The run of calves was moderate, but the demand for them was fairly active for market. The demand at present is only for good stock, and others are not wanted.

East Buffalo Cattle Markets. East Buffalo, May 5.—Cattle—Receipts, 200 head; slow and barely steady; veal steady; tops, \$6.75 to \$7; common to good, \$4.50 to \$5.50.

Chicago Live Stock.

Chicago, May 5.—Cattle—Receipts, 2,500, including 600 Texans; nominal; but steady; \$5.50 to \$6; poor to medium, \$4.25 to \$5; good to prime, \$6.75 to \$7; common to good, \$4.50 to \$5.50.

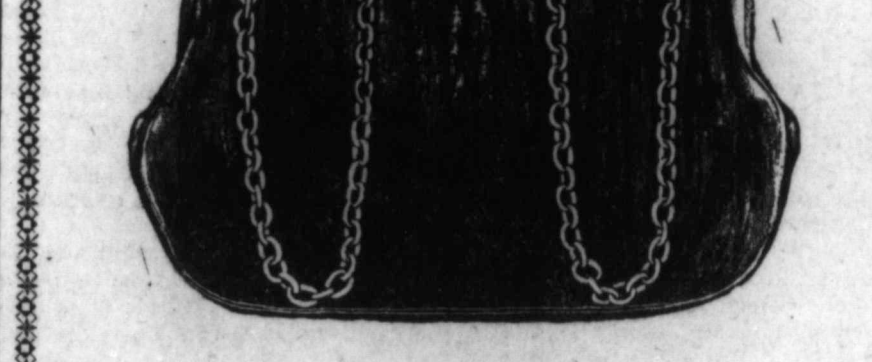

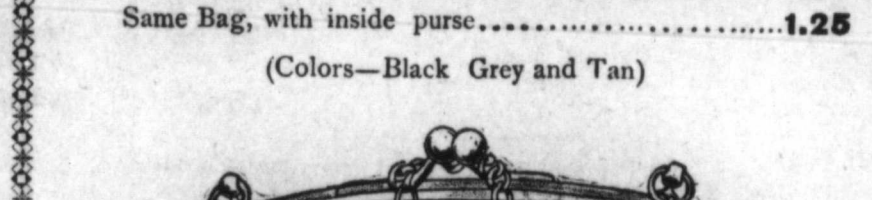

THE CANADIAN NORTHWEST

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Territories, excepting 8 and 28, which has not been homesteaded or reserved to provide wood lots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

ENTRY

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land to be taken is situated, or if the homesteader cannot be present, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land is situated, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A fee of \$10 is charged for a homestead entry.

HOMESTEAD DUTIES

Under the present law homestead duties must be performed in one of the following ways, namely: (1) By at least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years, or— (2) If the father (or the mother, if the father is deceased) of any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of the law as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother, or— (3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by himself in the vicinity of his homestead the requirements of the law as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of the three years before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector. Before making application for patent the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of his intention to do so.

INFORMATION

Newly arrived immigrants will receive at the Immigration Office in Winnipeg, or at the Dominion Lands Office in Manitoba or the Northwest Territories, information as to the lands that are open for entry, and from the officers in charge, free of expense, advice and assistance in securing lands to suit them. Full information respecting the land, timber, coal and mineral laws, as well as respecting Dominion lands in the railway belt in British Columbia, may be obtained upon application to the Secretary of the Department of the Interior, Ottawa; the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, Manitoba, or to any of the Dominion Lands Agents in Manitoba or the Northwest Territories.
