#### Life in the Polar Regions.

It is impossible to form an idea of a tempest in the Polar seas. The icebergs are like floating rocks whirled along a rapid like floating rocks whirled along a rapid current. At 15° below zero a steam, as if from a boiling kettle, rises from the water. At once frozen by the wind, it falls in a fine powder. This phenomenon is called sea-smoke. At 400 the snow and human bodies also smoke, which smoke at once changes into millions which smoke at once changes into millions of tiny particles like needles of ice, which fill the air and make a light, continuous noise, like the rustle of a stiff silk. At this noise, like the rustle of a stiff silk. At this temperature the trunks of trees burst with a loud report, the rocks break up, and the earth opens and vomits smoking water. 
