And, "an act for appropriating and disposing of the Public Monies."

After which his Excellency was pleased to make the following speech to both Houses.

"THE business before you being now finished, I have the fatisfaction to close the present Session in full confidence of your persevering endeavours, both, by a vigilant exertion of such authority as you are invested with, and by the influence of your example to strengthen and confirm among all ranks of the people, that spirit of industry, and those habits of temperance and good order, which are so essential to the growth and prosperity of this infant colony."

The General Assembly prorogued.

And then the Clerk of the Crown, by his Excellency's Command, declared the General Assembly to be prorogued to the second Tuesday in October next.
