ed by law，enables the venders to have thei places open from early in the morning till lat
at night，and all night for that matter ；and it affords a cloak for the contraband sale much stronger drink，which it is difficult fo the executors of the law to detect，so long as
persons can sell this beer without license or family of boys，informed him，almost wit tears in his eyes，that the unrestricted sale o
Bavarian and Botanic beer was the missin
link necessary to complete the destruction the youth of the country．Such being the case，
he（Mr．M．）should feel more pleased had the Hon．Colonial Secretary felt himself in a posi－
tion to give an assurance that in fature the sale of this beer should be restrained and license lav． he was informed，are places where parties，aft being shat out of the licensed liquor stores，
resort to，and drink and play cards for the balance of the night．In view of this state of
