Market Notes.

Codfish.—Some activity in purchas y for the Brazilian market. Hard Labrador soft bringing \$11 to \$11,50, with indications of steadying at these figures. In foreign markets, Brazil's emands are improving and Spain is holding out offers of more buying. A congestion is feared at Oporto where there are over 46,000 quintals in stores and five Newfoundland cargoes outside the bar, with a weekly consumption of 3,500 quintals, so far. With the coming of Lent, now barely over a fortnight hence, an increased demand may be expected.

Cod Oll.—Prices have not undergone any material change since last

week's report, in either common or refined, a small lot of the latter havng changed hands at \$2.25 per gallon. Herring.—Scotch Pack, large fulls have gone off to \$18, other grades being \$16 to \$17.50. Splits are in good

demand at from \$7 to \$7.50.

Provisions.—Standard Flour prices are firm at \$14.25 to \$14.75 wholesale, and \$15 to \$15.80 retail. Pork is being quoted in the following grades: Ham Butt, \$48; Mess and Short Cut Clear, \$50; Family Mess, \$60. Beef prices are: Bos Flank, \$47.50 to \$48; Boneless, \$46.50 to \$47 and Plate, \$46. to \$46.50. Very few sales are being made at the above prices at present. It is probable that by the end of the month the sugar regulations will be lightened by the lifting of the compulsory purchase of brown in equal proportion to white. Prices to-day are White Granulated, \$12.10; Brown, \$10.50 per hundred pounds.


