That the Venus di Milo, undoubtedly the most beautiful statue in the world, most casual glance, but in what position they were sculptured, and what became of them, are mysteries which

A French warship had been dispatched to Melos to bring the statue in the harbour, on May 23rd, 1829, a Horse Shoes, etc. Greek ship, flying the Turkish flag, was already at the dock and a party of Greek and Turkish saflors were pre-

Both French and Turkish sailors were landed, and a fight ensued for possession of the treasure, the French being victorious.

When the melee was over and the French vessel sailed for Piraeus, it is said that the venus bore irreparable

But this is part of the mystery which surrounds the statue, for, as the story of the affair did not come to light until nearly half a century later, the details could never be substantiated, and there is more than a suspicion that the statue was broken during its trip on the warship, and that the story of the fight was concocted in order to explain

In fact, the only undisputed points about this famous statue are that it was discovered on the Island of Melos and that it now stands, broken but magnificent, in the place of honour in the Louvre at Paris. All the rest is conjecture, rumour and mystery. Pearson's Weekly.
