Qualification of Trustees In Municipal School Districts

The qualification of candidates for election as trustees for any municipal school district shall, mutatis mutandis. be the like qualifications as are prescribed by law for persons eligible for election as Aldermen or Councillors of the municipality comprised in the school district, except that every candidate shall be actually resident in the school district. The wife or the husband of every person who is qualified to become a candidate for election as a trustee under the fore-going provisons of this section shall, if she or he is of the full age of twenty-one years and is actually resident in the school district, be qualified also to become a candidate for election as a trustee for the school
