Paper Bag Cookery Rules

Grease slightly the inside of the bag, except in the case of vegetables or when water is added. For beginners, it is advisable. Butter, lard or dripping may be used.

FISH CROQUETTES.
1 pound or 2 cups cooked fish of any variety.

Salt. Pepper. 2 tablespoons white sauce. Cayenne.

1 teaspoon chopped parsley. 1 teaspoon lemon juice.

Flake fish, add seasoning and lemon juice, and mix to a paste with white sauce. Form into croquettes, roll in egg and bread-crumbs, place in well-greased paper bag and cook for 20 minutes in a very hot oven.
