[Special Cable to The Advertiser.] Heron and two trawlers returned to with more than a hundred bodies. of whom the majority were women. All are being taken to the temporary mergue in the town hall as fast as recovered, and the admiralty has ordered that every effort be made to secure all victims.

The scenes on the quay here as survivers arrived were pitiful in extreme. Women wet and bedraggled, their faces lined with terror from the experience that they had been through, were clinging to men, many of whom wore shirts and trousers. Many still had their lifebelts encircling their bodies. Nearly all were without shoes. Little children clung to their parents and cried bitterly. Two little tots helped ashore an elderly lady who had been a long time in the water, and who collapsed on the pier.

REPORTS 634 SAVED

American Consul at Queenstown Reduces Previous Estimate.

Washington, May 8 .- A dispatch received at the state department early today from Consul Lauriat at Queenstown put the number of rescued of all nationalities from the Lusitania disaster at 634. An earlier dispatch from him said 700. The consul's latest message added the names of four Americans saved to those mentioned in his previous dispatch, making a total of 51 Americans saved. Few others were rescued, he said.
