

GLACIER PLAYS PRANKS.

It Gave Canada a Harbor and Now

Takes It Back.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 26. — The grand Pacific glacier in Alaska at the head of Glacier Bay has been "playing Indian" with Canada by giving her a harbor on the Alaskan coast and then taking it back again, according to Prof. Lawrence Martin of the University of Wisconsin, who returned yesterday after making a survey of the glaciers in that region for the National Geographic Society.
