Fear for Safety of Leader of Promoters and Owners of the Revolution.

Shanghal, Aug. 18—Dr. Sun Yat Sen, the ex-provisional president of China, disregarding the warning of friends who fear for his safety since the execution of several Hankow safety since the execution of several Hankow generals, left Shangnai to-day for Perkin. General Huang Sing, who commanded the Southern Republican army in the revolution, which overthrew the Imperial government, and who was to have accompanied Dr. Sun, has abandoned the journey. The southern generals recently put to death were members of Dr. Sun Yat's party, the Tung men Hui, and were seized at the capital by direction of President Yuan Shi Kai, on the charge of being implicated in an alleged conspiracy against the Pekin government. Two of the officers were tried by drumhead court martial at the capital and shot. The others were returned capital and shot. The others were returned in chains to Hankow and there executed.
