Lawson's Concentrated

The Touching Letter that Lilian Geodfellow Wrote Her Umantural Father.

The St. Thomas Daily Times of Thursday gives a detailed account of the circumstances leading up to the suicide of George W. Goodfellow at Aylmer on Tuesday evening last. Goodfellow was the proprietor of the large mills bearing his name, which are well known throughout Western Onterio. At six c'clock on Tuesday evening he was arrested on the Meinous charge of incest, the victim being his daughter! Lilian, aged 14 years, and a quarter of an hour after being taken into custody he shot himself through the head.

On Saturday, June 9, Lilian left her father's house. At a neighbor's residence she wrote a stater which afterwards fell into the hands of Rev. Mr. McGundry, in which she made the plaarges against her father. Her father followed her and brought her back, but she went away again, this time with her father's knowledge.

The letter, already referred to which was

ave pretended to love me but instead of siving me you hate me '.' You have deprived me of young company and of the freedom which is necessary to young girls like sie. I have gone where I can have these kings, and it you ever find me it will do you so good, because I shall put myself under the protection of the laws of this country, and if you come after me I would appeal to them for protection and they would send you to Penitentiary for life. Papa. I did love you once, but 'there is no more love in my heart for you, and it I stayed at home and et. You do 'as you liked I would be a corpse before I was 19 years of age. I have only \$1.25, but I will use it to got among strangers. You have alw ys got me the best of clothes, but I would rather wear an old print dress and shoes with the toes out and have a clear conscience than stay at home and do as I have done. No taker that loved his child would whip her as you have whipped me. It is the greatest sin that man can commit to ruin his own dear shidren that God gave him to love and care sur. "Thou shalt not commit adultery."

Goodfellow had previously had the pater-

wives. After Lilian's second disappearance the excitement continued to grow until on Thursday night hast a mob of 200 collected in front of Gondfellow's house and burned him in effigy. Goodfellow thereupon opened fire upon the crowd with a revolver and the mob retalisted with a fusilade of stones, wrecking one or two windows. Goodfellow them sallied forth revolver in hand, and the mob scattered, a number of bullets being sent after them. Monday the prisoner, who had not previously walked fauther up town than the bank, coufining himself as much as possible to his mill, proceeded east to the postoffica. The street was lined with people and he was hooted for several blocks. Monday night a report was circulated that Lilian; had been kept secreted in the cellar, and another rumor was affoat that her father had killed her. Goodfellow had meantime made no attempt to clear away the charges

Adam Morse will not return to Savanna As he is a free man, free to go wheresoever he he wishes to avoid, there is not the slightest probability that he will revisit the Georgian espital. In accordance with previous arrange-

probability that he will revisit the Georgian expital. In accordance with previous arrangements, Morse reappeared before Judge McDougall yesterday morning. When last before His. Honor, on the 15th inst, he was remanded for a week, in the expectation that Detective Weatherhorn, who was ill in Georgia, would be able to attend and sign his evidence, as his signature was necessary before Morse could be transferred from the custody of the Canadian authorities to those of the United States. When the refugee was brought up yesterday there was, as usual, a large number of people in the court room. Among those present were Hon. John Macdonald (who recently subscribed \$100 to the detence fund) and Mr. John Carson, who appeared for the County Crown Attorney, announced that the long-expected Mr. Weatherhorn would not attend, and he produced a telegram from Solicitor-General Osborna of Georgia, in which it was stated that the Georgian detective was still unable to leave his bed. Under these circumstances Mr. Carson considered that he was justified in asking for another remand of a week. Mr. W. G. Murdoch and Mr. Walter Read, on behalf of the prisoner, opposed the application, urging that there was neither evidence nor affidavit to show that Weatherhorn was ill. Judge McDougall agreed that there was no evidence, and as he had made the last adjournment a peremptory one there was no other course open for him but to discharge the prisoner. Morse was immediately surrounded by his friends, and heartily congratulated. It is believed that he will continue to reside in Toronto.
