DID WHALE KILL HIS WIFE? A CONSERVATIVE "MORAL VICTORY"

AN OLD TORONTO HOTEL-KEEPER
ARRESTED AT MICHIGAN.

The wife of Daniel Whale, formerly of the Windsor, found dead on the floor of her home with a bullet in her brain—damaging admissions by the prisoner.

MICHIGAN, Ont., Aug. 12.—Not since the brutal murder of J. Houghton last June has this quiet little town been thrown into such a state of excitement as it was yesterday morning when it was learned that Daniel Whale had been shot and killed. There were all sorts of reports as to the cause of death, some going so far as to state that they expected a tragedy like this to be followed by the unhappy domestic relations of Whale and his wife. The affair occurred in the north ward. Whale is a retired hotel-keeper, having owned a place in Richmond-street Toronto. He and his wife have had frequent misunderstandings, and it is said that early Monday morning they had another, which culminated in Mrs. Whale, the wife, in which the tragedy occurred is only a short distance from the Royal Hotel. When William Taylor, a neighbor, was called upon to see what was the matter, he found a woman lying in a pool of blood, which was coming from a wound in the neck, making her head roll over the wainscoting and upon the carpet. A revolver was found in Whale's bed with one chamber discharged. Whale was found in a state of collapse in the room, and he came over and held an inquest last night in the town hall.

Six years ago he sold the Windsor Hotel, Church-Richmond-street, where he has been living until about nine months ago when he moved to Mitchell. His property here is a good-sized family, and he is married to John Sheppard, formerly a partner at the Windsor, and who accompanied the Whales to Mitchell.

John Whaley of 180 Church-street, who knew the couple all the time they conducted the Windsor Hotel, said last night that Whale was a good-hearted, good-natured fellow, who was always ready to give a person a hand. He was in the city three or four years ago when he had a quarrel with Mrs. Tracey, but the reporter that both sometimes took a little more drink than was good for them, and when under the influence of liquor were both inclined to be quarrelsome. "One Sunday morning," said Mrs. Tracey, "Mrs. Whale was looking into my eyes and she said, 'You don't know Whale, he's a beast.' I suppose he had been beating her, and I have heard it reported that she did not resist her own cruelty."
