

PAT PURCELL'S WILLS.

Their Validity Is Being Tested in the Court—\$450,000 Involved—Toronto Street Railway Company.

Mr. Winchester yesterday made an order allowing the Toronto Street Railway Company to pay into court the sum of \$1500 as security for the costs of their appeal from the order of Mr. Justice Robertson, dismissing the appeal from the award of the arbitrator in the matter of the arbitration between the city and the old street railway company.
