## NOTE AND COMMENT.

Carefully prepared statistics show that last year new churches were established in the United States at the rate of eight a day, and that saloons went out of business at the rate of thirty a day. Is this a case of cause and effect?

The new standard Fire Insurance Policies which took effect on Aug. 1st, as revised by the Provincial Legislature at its last session, will, according to the new statutory conditions contain a lightning and dynamo clause. Mercantile and dwelling risks in towns and cities will be free from all variations to statutory conditions. Policies on farm risks will contain a vacancy clause, steam and gasoline threshing permits, instructions regarding proof of loss of live stock when killed by lightning which will also be covered while on pasture land rented by the assured and while going to market or to stable. Agents will be authorized to vary the limits of loss from \$75 to \$150 in the case of horses, from \$30 to \$40 on horned cattle and from \$6 to \$10 on other animals and where larger limits are

wired. The animals should be specially insured by name.

Scattered over Eastern Canada may be found exceptionally good farmers who have made ten, twenty and forty thousand dollars at dairying, and hog-raising, fruit-growing or mixed husbandry, and better opportunities than they had are still open. In the West, such examples would be blazoned forth in immigration literature, written up in the papers, and heralded far and wide to indicate the resources of the country. What the East needs is self-discovery through advertising.

The assessors of Owen Sound fixed the sum of two thousand dollars as the income assessment on the salary of Judge C. H. Widdfield, and the latter appealed to the court of revision with the result that the assessors were upheld in their action. An appeal was at once entered before County Judge C. T. Sutherland, and the case was threshed out. The contention of the appellant was that the salary of a civil servant could not legally be taxed. There was precedent for this view, in a case that was adjudicated upon at Ottawa. There was also another case of a similar nature where a directly opposite decision was given. In his finding Judge Sutherland held that the town had power to tax the income of a civil servant and dismissed the appeal.

The following item from the pen of Peter McArthur, the versatile farmer-journalist, hits off the situation in Lambton country to a nicety:—"Once more I am impressed by the suddenness of the wheat harvest. One day we were looking at the yellow fields and the next at the rows of shocks. Perhaps it was because I was so busy in the haying that I did not notice the farmers at work, but one morning in looking around I saw that the transformation had taken place, and it seemed as we had passed from summer into autumn overnight. It will be only a short time until the oats are harvested, and then the season's work will be practically over. And it seems only a few days ago since I was fussing with the seeding in the spring. Certainly there is nothing like being entirely busy to make the time slip by quickly. Perhaps it would be different if I once got ahead of my work, but all season I have been from three days to a week behind, and that has kept me on the jump."

A most interesting case of healing occurred at New Canaan, recently. Three weeks ago Sunday Addison Campbell had the end of one of his fingers cut off while playing with the cutting bar of a mowing machine. When the lad ran into the house with a bleeding stump of his finger, his sister rushed out and after a search found the missing piece, brought it in, washed the wound and placed the two pieces together and held them in place for an hour or more until Dr. Keene, of Essex, arrived. Splints were then applied, and the pieces have grown together almost as good as before the accident.

## STORY OF A CHURCH.

Curious History of an Unfinished Edifice in England.

There is a curious history regarding an unfinished church which stands at Hassall, near Sandbach, England. A former resident at the local hall, a Mr. Lowndes, painfully conscious of the lack of provision for the spiritual wants of the people in the neighborhood, determined to build a church at his own expense. After carefully choosing a site he gave instructions for the erection of a structure in the modern style capable of seating 400 or 500 persons.

Work on it was begun in the summer of 1836 and was pushed on steadily until the day on which Queen Victoria was crowned, by which time the building was well advanced. The crypts, about ten in number, had been put in, the walls and roofs were complete, and the scantlings for the floor were fixed. Indeed, partly in consequence of the national rejoicings and partly to celebrate the progress which had been made, the building was smothered in flags and decorations and was the center of local festivities.

Next day Mr. Lowndes was seized with an illness which quickly proved fatal, and with his passing all work on the church ceased. Though the building could have been finished at comparatively small cost, it was abandoned, and it has not been used since, except by tourists, whose names "hal-low and adorn it," as Mark Twain said of those on the ruins of Cain's altar, by the thousand—Wide World Magazine.

## LOOSE SHOES.

Those Not Fastened Tight at the Instep Cause Foot Trouble.

Seven persons out of ten suffer excruciating pain at one time or another with their feet. A single corn no larger than a grain of sand can take all the "snap" and vitality right out of you.

Two-thirds of modern foot troubles are due to the fact that almost every one—man, woman and child—wears his shoe too loose. The shoe itself may be correct as to size and shape, but it is not fastened tight at the only point of control—namely, the instep.

When you set your foot upon the floor or pavement in the act of walking the shoe adheres, and if it be loosely fastened over the instep the foot pushes down into the toe of the shoe. At certain spots on the foot this slipping causes friction. These spots are the soles of the feet, the tops, ends and inner sides of the toes, the great and little toe joints and occasionally even the back of the heel.

When the friction thus caused is continued hour after hour and day after day one or more of these spots are almost sure to become inflamed and sore. A slight thickening, called a "callous," is formed. As the friction and pressure go on the resulting callous may thicken up unevenly; then it is called a "corn."—Woman's Home Companion.

## The Satan of the Greeks.
