Ottawa, Feb. 3-Tne naval policies of the political parties in Canada were exposed in the house of commons today.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier defined the stand of the government, Mr Borden declared the policy of the opposition, and Mr. Monk announced the attitude of the opposition, to the opposition.

Sir Wilfrid declared for a navy of eleven vessels built in Canada within the next four years.

Mr. Monk declared that the government's policy changed the relations of Canada and the mother country and that the question of a navy should be put to the country in the form of a plebiscite.

Hon. Mr. Lemieux thought that after the unanimous resolution passed in March last it might have been expected that the two parties would have been united on the question of a Canadian navy.
