SUPPORT OF THE RELIGIOUS PRESS—It cannot be known, except by those who have the experience, what heavy sums are required to build up and sustain a religious newspaper. It differs from the secular press in this respect, that, while political papers are crowded with advertisements, sometimes three quarters of a paper being filled with them, these are nearly excluded from the religious press from custom and the force of public opinion. Thus a penalty is paid for advocating Religion. In some parts of the country this difficulty is beginning to be appreciated. Lately a proposition was adopted by the Synods of Cincinnati, Ohio, Indiana, and Wabash, New School, to raise \$15,000 for the establishment of the Cincinnati Christian Herald, a very judicious and excellent paper, on a firmer and broader basis. Local religious papers are found to be indispensable to the prosperity of the Churches and the utmost efficiency of the Ministry. It is the matter adapted to local interests, which gives a religious paper its greatest attraction and value.—*Congr. Journal.*
