I have the honour to refer to your letter of September 12th, 1956 regarding an extension of the modus vivendi which governs trade between Canada and Venezuela.

The Canadian Government feels that this modus vivendi has been instrumental in strengthening trade relations between Canada and Venezuela. Accordingly, I have the honour to propose that it be extended for a further period of one year, from October 11, 1956.

Should Your Excellency's Government concur in this proposal, may I suggest that this Note, together with Your Excellency's reply, shall be considered as constituting an Agreement between the Government of Canada and the Government of Venezuela to renew the terms of the modus vivendi of October 11, 1950*, for a further period of one year.

I take this opportunity of presenting to Your Excellency the assurance of my highest consideration.
