R. BRADLEY WINS STAKE AT WINDSOR

Back Bay at Odds-On Beaten in Feature Race Before Record Crowd.

RACE TRACK, Windsor, Ont., July 18.—The largest crowd that ever witnessed a race run over the Windsor track was present this afternoon. Close to 10,000 persons were in attendance, and much enthusiasm was in evidence. The management provided a splendid program, and Saturday half-holiday racegoers showed their keenness for the sport, the bookies reporting the play heavier than at any other track on the circuit. Besides the Pendertrain Stakes, a dash of six furlongs, a 700 handicap at one mile and a race for Canadian-bred horses were the attractions. The track was faster than on any day during the meeting, and spirited racing was in order.
