OTTAWA, Oct. 11.—The following officers of the Canadian Expeditionary Force have been appointed to command brigades in the Canadian training division at Shorncliffe, and are given the rank of temporary colonel: Lieut.-Col. Special Cable to The Toronto World. PETROGRAD, Oct. 11.—The violent battle which has been raging in the region of Dvinsk, between the Germans under Von Hindenburg and the Russians under Gen. Ruzsky is developing in favor of the Russian army, which has reduced the Germans to the defensive, plunging them down to a line of trenches, and forcing them out of several strong positions. The Russians ejected the enemy from Gournovskaya, northwest of Dvinsk, and forced him to flee by renewed attacks. On the high road between Lautz and Dvinsk, the enemy was driven out of his trenches, and in the pursuit the Russians captured the Teuton line of trenches, extending from the southeastern end of Lake Medoussi to Lautz. A Russian air raid south of Friedland was successfully carried out, bombs being dropped on German positions in two villages. In return, German aviators bombed Dvinsk and the nearest railway stations.
