At workingmen in a shop would join in the services. Gradually, however, the number increased until 50 or more would gather around and listen to the services. A few moments of the fifteen would be given to song, and the remainder to a short discourse on Christianity. In order to decide whether the services were popular or not, the question was recently put to a popular vote of the workingmen, and every workingman voted for a continuation of the noon-hour services.
