It is not possible to estimate what proportion of the 425,000 miners affected remained at work and what proportion walked out. The real test may not come until Monday. 



President Gompers of the American Federation of Labor, with Vice-President Woll and Secretary Morrison, protested as a delegation to Attorney-General Palmer against the Government's action in issuing the injunction and predicted that it could "only result in creating new and more disturbing issues which may not be confined solely to the miners."

Heads of the great railway brotherhoods also conferred with the attorney-general, but disclaimed that they did more than offer their services to intervene.
