HAMILTON, Nov. 17 .- (Special.)-Robert Roadhouse, the Socialist, has returned to the city and gave an address this evening in a hall on Macnab-street, in which he alleged that the proprietor of the King Edward Mine, for a consideration of \$3000, got The Toronto Mail and Empire to publish a false state-ment that the Cobalt strike was settled. Readhouse declared that in Cobalt there were but six real mines, the other twenty-seven being made up of a shaft, a machine and a bunch of deluded stock-holders. He also stated that there was no silver to be found in four-fifths of the Cobalt ore.
