## FEW LIBERALS FOR LOW TARIFF

Only Three, it is Said Responded to a Recent Circular.

(Cor. Toronto News.)

Ottawa, July 10.—Your correspondent often has occasion to note the fact that there are times when the Liberal party on outside the chamber is more interesting than that which is allowed to take place inside it. Here is a proof of this. The text of a circular which was sent out not long ago to suitable persons:

"Ottawa, 25th June, 1908.

"Dear Sir,

"A meeting of the Liberal members of the senate and house of commons who are in sympathy with the low tariff principles will be held in the tower room on Thursday evening, the 2nd day of July next, at the hour of 8.30.

"If this accords with your views, please attend."

"Such was the notice sent out. There are about 60 Liberal senators and 140 Liberal M. P.'s, and, gentle reader, how many of these 200 do you suppose attended? The meeting is understood to have consisted of three. One, it is understood, was Mr. Finlay, of East Peterborough; one was Mr. McCreary, of Saskatchewan, and the third was a Quebec member.

"It must, in justice, be noted that Thursday was a busy night, it being on that evening that the Aylesworth bill received its second reading and got into committee. Still, when we remember the plot of form of '93, and ponder on certain free trade editorial that we see every now and then in Liberal newspapers, three does seem a small number."

## REVOLVING HOUSE TO CURE INSOMNIA

Owner Will Be Enabled to Move His Windows in any Direction to Woo Zephyrs or Avoid Light.

(New York Herald.)

To follow the breeze in summer and the sunshine in winter, a house will soon be constructed in Bayview, Ont., for William Galtman, a jeweller, of No. 328, Fifth Avenue. It will rest upon a turntable, and the owner will supply power to make it revolve at the owner's desire. The wind may blow where it pleases, but it cannot evade Mr. Galtman, who, seated in an easy chair within reach of an electric switch button, may start his pet corner on the trail of the breeze and win his cooling breeze.

Clarence Truitt, an architect, at No. 9, Galtman street, has been discussing plans for the house with Mr. Galtman. At first, he said yesterday, the project seemed to present serious difficulties, especially in regard to arrangement of sewer and water pipes.

"It has all proved very simple, however," he continued. "Mr. Galtman's house will be just like any other fine suburban residence of its kind, so far as outward appearance goes. Of course, it will be necessary to have steps from every doorway, so that when the house comes to a standstill, the doors will be available."

"It will rest on a turntable, which will have a diameter about equal to the narrow part of the superstructure. The rear porch and other parts will project over the lawn, so that when the house is revolved, none of the turntable foundation will be visible."

"Motion will be given from the engine in the pantry to a wheel with racks under the foundation frame, and this will move in a circular plane. Other similar rails

## restless tendency on the part of some of the smaller shorts, they covered and prices improved about a half dozen points with the market finally called very steady. The larger shorts did not cover. Liverpool cables came better than expected, and better than justified. To what extent the main force and manipulation secured the unwarranted advance in the English market may be suggested by the control of an interest there that has already lost heavily in the way of submerging premiums until their ability to see the thing through is questioned and made more difficult by the attitude of Liverpool spot buyers who are getting their supplies from Bremen and Havre to the neglect of the Liverpool stock. Just before the close here yesterday New Orleans orders started a rise of five to six points and closed our market 2 to 3 points net higher. Spot people who have been steadily acquiring October and selling January and March were the leading buyers of that position late yesterday, the same parties controlled the local stock. But the crop news continues most favorable and must overshadow all other influence until some reverse. The stronger bears see no reason to change their position and regard recent small rallies as resting places on the way to an inevitably still lower level of values.
