With Manitoba the Postal Communication is daily, all the year round.

And so on, 3 cents being charged for every additional ½ oz, or fraction of a ½ oz. On letters left at a Post Office for delivery from the same office one cent is charged.

BETWEEN CANADA AND NEWEOUNDLAND.

Letters to Newfoundland are charged at the rate of 6 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., and must in all cases be prepaid.

BETWEEN CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES.

The same rates are charged upon letters passing by mail to the United States, and must in all cases be prepaid by rostage stamp.

BETWEEN CANADA AND THE UNITED KINGDOM.

The rates charged on letters sent from Canada for delivery in the United Kingdom are 5 cents for a letter weighing not more than $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., and an additional 5 cents for every additional $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. over.
