

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

FOR THE YEAR 1892.

The thirteenth Annual Exhibition of the Academy was held in the National Gallery, at Ottawa, in March last year, there were upwards of two hundred pictures hung on the walls.

The Exhibition was well attended. His Excellency Lord Stanley, of Preston, the Governor-General, Lady Stanley of Preston, and party were present; also many of the Members of Parliament, Senators and Citizens of Ottawa.

The meetings of the Council and General Assembly were more numerously attended than on any former occasion.

The election of the officers for 1892 and '93 resulted in Mr. O. R. Jacobi being President; Mr. A. C. Hutchison, of Montreal, Vice-President. Mr. Jas Smith was elected Secretary-Treasurer, and Mr. Henry Langley, Architect, Toronto, was chosen Auditor.

The usual grants in aid of Advanced Art were made to the local Academicians, in Montreal, Ottawa and Toronto.

Arrangements were made with the Dominion Government, through Professor Saunders, whereby an Exhibition of Canadian Art would be held in Chicago in connection with the World's Columbian Exhibition. The space allotted to Canada in the Fine Art Building averaged 3000 superficial feet. The Government agreed to pay all expenses in connection with the exhibition.
