

Ottawa, June 17—Miss Arnoldi, of Toronto, who with Miss Plummer, has been engaged in England and at the front in administering to the needs and comforts of Canadian soldiers, is in Ottawa and will visit the various centres throughout the country to arrange for the forwarding of more socks and various other comforts which thousands of Canadian women have gladly provided. Miss Arnoldi is a daughter of Frank Arnoldi, K. C., Toronto, who has three sons at the front. Miss Plummer is in England continuing the work.

General Sam Hughes expresses high appreciation of their efforts.

The report of shipping at this port for the period beginning November 1, 1914, and ending May 1, 1915, shows an increase of 70 vessels in the trans-Atlantic trade, as compared with the corresponding period for the previous season; but the tonnage was notable for a decrease of 74,605 tons.


