EVIDENCE IN STEEVES CASE

The crown opened its case yesterday against O. Galus Steeves of Cowville, charged with the murder of his wife, Ivan C. Rand and T. T. Goodwin are acting for the crown and Senator George W. Fowler is representing the accused.

The fire in the stove could not have got hot enough to set fire to anything in the short time after he went out.
