OPPOSITE THE MARKET

Says Greed Responsible For Conditions In West

Sydney, June 19.—Rev. D. M. MacAdam, pastor of one of the largest English-speaking churches in Canada, in an address to the graduating class at the convent of the Holy Angels here urged the young ladies to right the wrongs of their sex. Now they have the vote he hoped they would influence affairs so as to secure better working conditions for their own sex. No one seemed to consider the working woman. While he did not agree with Bolshevism as practiced in Russia now take his stand with the strikers of western Canada, nevertheless he did not think it strange, he said, that when a government did not protect its people the people should take the law into their own hands.

He pointed out that greed was responsible for the conditions prevailing, greed of the powerful over the weak, greed of the wealthy classes preying on the poor, in this connection he made special reference to the telegraph companies which, he stated, employed young girls to take messages at the rate of two and a half cents a message. To rectify just such conditions were women fitted into politics. The thing then was to educate the women. But education alone, continued Father MacAdam, was not always constructive. Sometimes it can be destructive. There must be a safe ideal. Education without religion can never raise the world.

To Render Empire Self-Supporting

Inter-Imperial Conference of Grain-Producing Interests

London, June 20.—A conference of representatives of grain-producing interests of Canada, Australia, South Africa and the United Kingdom, at the offices of the British Empire Producers' Association, passed a resolution that it was essential to adopt without delay measures to render the empire self-supporting in all essential foodstuffs and that the overseas dominions are prepared to cordially co-operate in any policy for the

British government to promote the agricultural interests of the Motherland, provided the principles of imperial preference are incorporated in any measure involving taxation of imports, and that His Majesty's government be recommended to remove wheat control as soon as adequate supplies and tonnage are available.

\$100,000 REQUEST TO HARVARD BY DR. MEARS

Philadelphia, June 20.—Harvard University is bequeathed \$100,000 for the study of methods to reform and cure criminals and mental defectives by surgery, under the will of Dr. J. Ewing Mears, which was probated here. Dr. Mears died here on May 28. He was eighty years old.
