The weather was not, in general, very favorable for the crops during May, on account of the heavy rains and late frosts. The production of wheat is estimated in Spain at 31,943,660 quintals, i. e. 79 per cent. of last year's production; in the United States it is estimated at 98,794. The statistical service of the institute, which was lately extended to include flax and cocoons, has, with the present issue of the bulletin, been still further enlarged, and now also embraces tobacco and sugarcane. Tables are given showing the latest official information available with reference to these two crops, and also in regard to vineyards and sugae-beet.
