## TRANSFORMING

## DELHI, INDIA'S

## NEW CAPITAL

## Rushing Construction of Tempor-

## ary Quarters For Government

## —Some of the Permanent Im-

## provements

Calcutta, Aug. 19.—The temporary office  
and quarters required to accommodate the  
Government of India while New Delhi is  
being built are being run up at high working  
pressures. Contractors and an army of masons, carpenters,  
and coolies are busy on the Metcalfe  
House estate and elsewhere. There is a  
possibility that a light railway may be  
laid down later on, so as to give easy  
means of communication between tempo-  
rary and New Delhi.

Delhi city stands to benefit considerably  
by the building of the new Imperial capi-  
tal. The lines of the Indian infantry in  
Dargah will eventually be vacated, as  
the new cantonments are built, and these  
one of the most unhealthy sites within the  
walls can be turned into an open space.  
"Long" for the city which it sadly needs.  
In the distant future, too, one can see a  
broad avenue driven through the network  
of narrow streets and gullies that lie be-  
tween the Jama Masjid and the southern  
wall. This would form a continuation of  
the great boulevard running northwards  
from Government House at Talkatora, and  
the one long road thus formed would  
have no rival in the East. Again, the  
squid bazars at Paharganj will be  
swept away; and the Sufi Bazaar and  
Shamshad will be made sweet and whole-  
some. These all will be done, and they  
have been little regarded in the past,  
but now their insanitary state becomes a  
matter of importance. The diversion of  
the Agra-Delhi chord line of railway is  
also certain to be undertaken, and this  
alone will be a great improvement, as the  
present station is a veritable cesspool.  
The Lahore Gate interferes with road com-  
munication south of the Fort station.  
One cannot yet say what the future of  
the present residences, hotels, and shops spring-  
ing up in New Delhi is likely to be, but  
into a suburb offering accommodation for  
those who are not within the official cir-  
cle. The overflow of the Indian popula-  
tion of Delhi may find an outlet in the  
direction of Ferozabad.

## BUILDING PROGRAMME FOR

## THE UNITED STATES NAVY

## One Battleship, Eight Submarines and

## Fleet of Other Vessels

Washington, Aug. 20.—One battleship to  
cost \$7,425,000 without armament, pre-  
sumed, and not to exceed \$10,000,000 when  
completed, eight submarines costing \$4,480,-  
100, the United States Navy is planning  
and machine ships constitute the building  
programme for the navy approved yester-  
day by the senate and which probably will  
be adopted without change by the house.  
The house and senate conferees on the  
naval bill met yesterday and adjourned in  
a few minutes the fight between the two  
houses over battleships and submarines.  
The senate yielded to the demand of the  
house for one battleship instead of two,  
but secured in exchange the full fleet of  
eight submarines instead of the four pro-  
posed by the house.

The conference report was brought into  
the senate and adopted without opposi-  
tion. The house deferred action on the  
report, ordering it printed.
