COMMISSION OF SYNOD.

The Synod appointed their Commission to meet in St. Andrew's Church, Montreal, on the Wednesday after the first Tuesday of November next, at noon; in St. Andrew's Church, Toronto, on the Wednesday after the third Tuesday of January next, at noon; and oftener by adjournment when and where the Commission may choose. Nine Commissioners shall be a quorum, of whom five must be Ministers.—In all their actings, the Commissioners shall proceed according to the Act of Synod, 1859, anent the nature, powers, and duties of the Commission of the Supreme Court of this Church.

VOTES OF THANKS.

It was moved by Mr. Croil, seconded by Dr. Barclay, and carried by acclamation, That the thanks of the Synod are due, and are hereby given to the friends of the Church in Kingston for their generous hospitality to the members in attendance at this meeting, and especially to Mr. John Paton and other members of the Committee of St. Andrew's Church, as well as to the ladies of the congregation, for their efforts in providing for the accommodation of members; and the Synod further record their thanks to the Grand Trunk and other Railway Companies that have granted to members attending this meeting a reduction in the rates of travel. The Clerk was instructed to give intimation thereof to these Companies.

The thanks of the Synod were also accorded to the proprietor of the Kingston "Daily News" for his kindness in opening the columns of his newspaper to reports of the Synod's proceedings, and to the Rev. Donald Ross, B.D., of Chatham, Q., for the full and accurate reports of each day's acts and debates that he at great labour prepared and furnished to the Press.

CLOSING OF SESSION.

The Moderator then addressed the Synod, and, after praise and prayer, said —

In the name of the LORD JESUS CHRIST, the KING and ONLY HEAD of this Church, and in the name of this Synod, I dissolve this meeting, and appoint the next annual meeting of Synod to convene in St. Andrew's Church, Hamilton, on the first Tuesday of June, Eighteen Hundred and Sixty-nine years, at seven o'clock, P.M.

Of which public intimation was made, and the Moderator pronounced the Apostolic Benediction.
