MIGRANTS.—From the 1st June to March 20 emigrants arrived at New York.
ARLICK.—Bismark has advised the South man States to be ready to take the debt spring.
The last Royal Gazette announces the appointment of Hon. John McAdon to the office of resident of the Executive Council.
It appears that the Imperial Government informed Prince Edward Island that it is competent for her to enter into negotiations with the United States with a view to proximity, without the co-operation of the North American Provinces. Evidently, the Home Government is determined that Islanders shall have no privileges which Confederation cannot obtain—Globe.
The mail between Italy and France have been badly snowed up this winter. One entrant is buried near the summit of Mont in Pass by an avalanche. The worst part of the routes are now traversed by mail cars on snow shoes.
The Royal Highness the Duke of Cambridge, by the death of Lord Gough, formerly the senior officer of the British army, ought by length of service Gen. Sir J. F. Gerald is the senior. The latter died in 1793. There are five others whose missions were issued before the beginning of the present century.

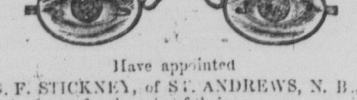
