The objects desired to be obtained by this Bill are: (1) To authorize an annual assessment on the City of St. John, N. B., for the purpose of providing for the maintenance of the Public Library.

(2) To provide that the amount so assessed shall be appropriated as follows: \$10,000 for the purchase of books; \$5,000 for the purchase of furniture and fixtures; \$5,000 for the purchase of a building for the library.

(3) In the event of the passage of this Bill, the City of St. John, N. B., shall be bound to provide for the maintenance of the Public Library.
