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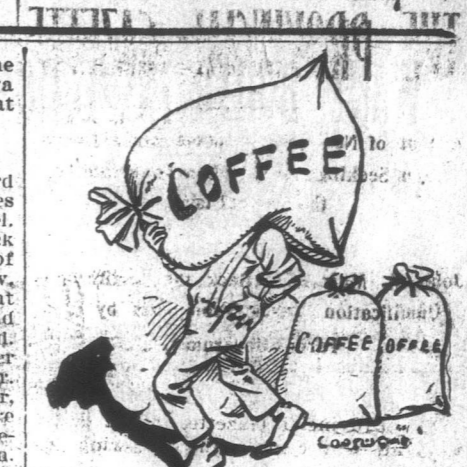

For years there have been discussions of adding the former passage of the English Channel by an enormous tunnel or bridge. A recent estimate of the cost of the bridge over the channel is the following by Vernon Harcourt: The bridge, traversing the channel at the Straits of Dover, would have a length of twenty-four miles. It is to be borne on 120 piers, the piers in the main deep channel attaining a depth of 130 feet below high water, and supporting the girders at a height of 180 feet above high water, to afford that clear roadway for vessels navigating this channel. The estimated amount of metal required is 1,000,000 tons, or about forty times the quantity used in the Forth bridge, and the estimated cost is about £24,000,000. The height of the largest girders is to be 213 feet, so that the total height of the highest portion of the structure would be about 390 feet above the sea bottom, or forty feet higher than the top of the spire of Cologne cathedral, the highest building in the world, with the exception of the Eiffel Tower. A bridge across the channel is not dependent upon the continuity of the straits, but upon the continuity of the straits from the channel to the open sea at such a depth, than a tunnel through chalk. Moreover, the much greater cost of a bridge across the channel, and the shipping in fogs or storms by a number of piers in midchannel, appear to render a channel bridge inexpedient, unless a tunnel were also constructed. (Impracticable.—Christian Endeavor World.)
