INTER-SOCIETY LEAGUE.

The largest and most enthusiastic crowd of spectators that has witnessed a game of ball on the Victoria grounds saw a double header on Saturday afternoon, and they certainly received the worth of their money.

There were about 800 people present, and the two full nine inning games were quickly played. The first game was between the St. Joseph's and F. M. A. team, and the second between the St. Peter's and St. Joseph's teams, and a singular thing was that the score in both games was the same, 10 to 3. The St. Joseph's outplayed the F. M. A. team for the first game and took the lead in the league by defeating the St. Peter's.

It only took an hour and 17 minutes for the first game to be played, and an hour and a half for the second game. The double umpire system was used, and Pete McAllister and John Malcolm were the men to decide the points.

The league executive thought differently, and this gave the St. Joseph's their only chance for the championship honors. The winning of Saturday's game therefore put the St. Joseph's ahead and for the first time since the league started St. Peter's went into second place.

THE TURF

ON SYDNEY TRACK.

SYDNEY, N. S., Aug. 19.—The horse races which were held on the Sydney track yesterday were very successful in every other respect but that of attendance, the crowd present numbering less than five hundred. The track was very fast and weather conditions all that could be desired. No records were broken, however, as Simmasse, winning the free-for-all walked under the wire a winner in every heat, and the other horses who raced against her, Diavolo and Windfall Stratton, having acted badly throughout, failing to give the speedy Halifax mare any kind of a close contest.

The best time was 2:18 in the third heat, time of other heats being 2:18 and 2:18.

Diavolo won second money in the free-for-all and Windfall Stratton was disqualified. Joseph Youngheart, the 15 year old veteran of the Nova Scotia turf, was the winner of the 2:35 class. He took first, this, and fourth heats, losing second to Valemore, which took second money. The best time of the race was 2:25. The yacht later was taken in tow by a tug for Marblehead.

MARBLEHEAD, Mass., Aug. 19.—After sailing three trial races today the German-American regatta committee of the Eastern Yacht Club selected the Caramba Auk and Vin to defend the Roosevelt cup against the three German Sander class yachts next month.

The Caramba won the second and third races today and was second in the first race. The Vin won the first race in which the Auk finished last and the latter was second in the second and third races.

BRISTOL, R. I., Aug. 18.—The sloops Sachem, Fred Thurber, of the Bristol Yacht Club, and Veranda, J. Allen Huntington, of the Rhode Island Yacht Club, got under way from this harbor shortly before 4 o'clock this afternoon for a race of 78 miles around Brenton's Reef and Vineyard Sound. Lightships, finishing at Newport. The race was undertaken at the challenge by Mr. Huntington, who allows the Veranda a handicap of 1 min. 50 sec.

CHICAGO, Aug. 18.—Four of the yachts that started in the Lipson cup series for 21-foot cabin yachts sailed today, were disqualified by the judges of the contest; the Toledo, of the Toledo Yacht Club, the Quin Sabe, of the Columbia Yacht Club; Mendoza, of the Milwaukee Yacht Club and New Illinois, of the New Illinois Athletic Club, were the boats disqualified. As soon as the yachts reached their moorings, R. P. Brown, skipper of the Milwaukee, which had finished third, protested the Toledo on the ground that it failed to cast off its tow line after the preparatory gun was fired at 1:55. The judges granted this protest and were then forced to take cognizance of the fact that Quin Sabe Mendoza and New Illinois were also disqualified. The yacht Cherry Circle by winning today counted one hundred points. The Milwaukee is second with 88; Raven, of Hamilton, Ont., third, with 78; Bill Poster, fourth, 67 points; and Yo Shan, fifth, with 55.6 points.
